10.15 – 11.00	Case study continued - War, Hull & Machinery We will continue to examine the fictional casualty and consider how the cover provided war risks and hull and machinery underwriters responds to the incident and the losses suffered

11.15 – 12.45	Cargo claims workshop This workshop will concentrate on cargo claims - the parties and the insurers, the legal framework, the carrier's obligations and defences, and how claims are resolved

13.45 – 15.00	People claims workshop This workshop will consider the claims that are made in respect of people in marine insurance – injuries to crew, stevedores and passengers, illness claims, stowaway problems. We will also consider the implications of recent cruise ship incidents

15.15 – 16.30	Admiralty, collisions, pollution Workshop This workshop will look in detail at the legal consequences of major incidents, covering the consequences of collisions, pollution liabilities worldwide, salvage obligations and practical insights on dealing with major casualties
16.30 – 17.45	Charterparty Workshop This session concentrates on the contractual framework of ship chartering, touching on payment of hire, loading and discharging responsibilities, and the commercial disputes which can arise in ship operation
