





Claims clarity

With ClaimsTrac you can have instant access to all the claims your business has logged with us.

For every claim logged you can view:

 the Claim Handler's Case Summary to see the issues at stake and the general strategy to bring the claim to conclusion

- a breakdown of the costs split between the claim itself, the handling fees and lawyers' and surveyors' fees
- The cost reserves set against each claim.





Analyse your claims

With ClaimsTrac you can undertake a full analysis of your claims records. We have standard reports which can tell you the value of your claims or arrange them by date of incident. There is also the ability to create bespoke reports. Records can be filtered by factors such as country, accounting year, claim status (open or closed) or risk type.

You can also look at what's causing the most expense to your business, by seeing where the most frequent or severe losses are occurring. You can look at groups of similar risks or drill down further into individual causes.

The real value is that claims information can be viewed any way you want it, from a total overview of all claims to the complete history of an individual claim. All reports can be saved within ClaimsTrac or exported to a software package such as MS Excel.

Record Statement

A summary of total contributions (premium) paid and estimated and total claims can be generated including the actual loss ratio for the current year and previous five years.

Maintaining Your Account

Records can be added or deleted and ranges of upper and lower limits set for analyses.



Visibility at Renewal

As well as using ClaimsTrac to view your claims information at any time we will also provide a Record Statement at renewal showing all paid and estimated claims.

Our Welcome Booklet and Making a Claim Booklet provide more information on our claims handling service and how it will support you.


Registering for My TT Club

Quay Crane Boom Anti-collision protection




Knowledge Store

It features a quick cross-reference guide showing which conventions apply in which countries, and uses a standard question and answer format to analyse the provisions and requirements of each convention.

The handbook provides an overview of current security initiatives and technologies, but is centered on the premise that the ISO 28000:2007 management standard offers a valuable framework for implementation.




Importance of Maintenance for Non-Engineers

We are a member of a number of international and national Trade Associations.

We see this as important because:

- It keeps us on the inside track of what is developing
- It enables us to provide input on specific initiatives as an insurer and as a Member organisation
- It enables us to deal with lots of different companies within the industry and be a focal point for Members' interests
- Through understanding the impact on all sections of the supply chain we are able to lobby for the right result for the industry as a whole
- Because of this unique position we are also invited to participate in discussions and present at conferences.

Examples of how we are influencing the industry include:

 The Dangerous Goods IMDG where we lobbied to change shore-side training regulations to make training mandatory rather than a recommendation. This was incorporated as part of Amendment 34-08

- The drafting of the International Labour Organisation (ILO) document for training of port side workers
- International Maritime
 Organisation (IMO) issues
 surrounding the weighing of
 containers where we are working
 with Maritime Administration and
 industry bodies to identify viable
 solutions to provide assurance of
 declared weight
- Our advisory membership of the CINS committee (Cargo Incident Notification System) and involvement with the CINSNET database which will give early warning of trends in unsafe practices
- Our continued sponsorship of FIATA's Young International Freight Forwarder of the Year Award which recognises the importance of training and development within the global freight forwarding community.

Access

to experts

We are always working to enhance our own expertise by networking with those who have particular operational and technical specialism throughout the industry.

An example of a key network relationship is with the International Cargo Handling Coordination Association (ICHCA).

We are represented on the ICHCA International Expert Panel which considers matters relating to safety, security and the environment.

ICHCA is dedicated to the promotion of safety and efficiency in the handling and movement of goods by all modes and during all phases of both the national and international supply chains.

It is a non-government organisation at the United Nations and has represented the cargo handling world at various international organisations including the International Maritime Organization and the International Labour Office. The Expert Panel represents a substantial cross-section of senior experts and professionals from all sectors of the cargo transport industry globally. Its main strategy is to develop authoritative guidance on matters concerning safety and health in cargo operations.

ICHCA's Expert Panel works on a personal invite basis only and is restricted to representatives who can provide a recognised contribution to the group. There are 70 international representatives on the panel including the unions, ship operators, ports, transport operators and engineers. TT Club's Risk Management Directors are on the panel and have led or participated actively in debates over specific issues.

As members of ICHCA's Expert Panel on Safety we can source advice and information from the experts on the safe movement of goods.

Our membership of the Expert Panel provides access to a broad network of key experts from whom we can source advice As an example we have used the panel in the past to support a Member with information on the handling, storage and transportation of wood pellets.

Within 24 hours we had feedback on the issues and what to look out for.


If you have an issue you should speak to your local Club contact who may know the answer, but if not we will happily approach the Panel or other specialists and ask the advice of the experts.
